Congratulations to St. Hubert for 76 years! Don't miss the Annual Heritage Days Sale in Bondurant coming up on August 12.




YOUTH SERVICE WEEK - JULY 10-14

They were like angels who suddenly appeared and spent nearly 5 hours nonstop setting up, helping us fill pots with beautiful flowers and cleaning up. A spirit of generosity, love and connection filled our church and community.







BUILDING OUR FUTURE TOGETHER

Habitat for Humanity of the Greater Teton Area will forever change the lives of 24 families by providing them the opportunity for homeownership. St. John's Episcopal Church is committed as Habitat's Lead Faith Partner for The Grove, Phase III project. The church will raise funds for one of the units and be a part of the selection committee for the family. Over the next 2.5

years, the parishioners and vestry of St. John's will raise \$250,000 towards the project.



On June 14, 2017, the Teton Habitat celebrated the groundbreaking of the project. As a partner, we are committed to 16 build days over the next 2 years. Habitat for Humanity's homes are built almost entirely by volunteers. Skilled

or unskilled, there are jobs for everyone! The staff of St. John's launched these build days on Wednesday, July 5. We invite you to lend a hand and learn new skills while giving back. Strengthen our community through the creation of homeownership opportunities for qualified deserving families. St. John's

build days will continue once a month until the project is completed. Upcoming build days include Wednesday, August 30 and Saturday, September 23 with a "Big Build" and commemorative T-shirts. All construction site volunteers must be 16 years of age.



We ask the community to lend the gifts of their voices, their dollars, their hands - or all three - to help bring this project to fruition. The estimated completion date of the project is June 2021. The Grove, located behind the Teton County Library at 825 W. Snow King Avenue, will provide 24 condos for homeownership for category 1 income earners. These 24 units will

consist of 1,200 square foot, 3-bedroom homes for category 1 individuals and families. The expected monthly mortgage payment will range from \$600 to \$1,000. The average rental for a 3-bedroom condo in Teton County is \$2,500. A Habitat home is a stabilizing force for a family in need and enables strength in members of our diverse community.
